

It's the spring of 1938 and no longer safe to be Jewish in Vienna. Nineteen-year-old Elise Landau realizes her only means of escape is to advertise her services as a domestic servant in England. Fate brings her ad to the attention of Christopher Rivers, handsome scion of the aristocratic Rivers family and master of Tyneford. An anxious Elise arrives at Tyneford and immediately falls under its spell. When Christopher's young son, Kit, returns home, the two strike up an unlikely friendship that will change Tyneford--and Elise--forever. If you watched *Downton Abbey*, you will enjoy this book!


**Growing Up** by Russell Baker

## While You're Waiting for... *Little Fires Everywhere*






# Windsor Library Reading Challenge: Read a Book over 500 Pages

This year, we are challenging you to read at least one book in 12 different categories for our Annual Reading Challenge. This month we're highlighting books over 500 pages.




### ***Rising Star: The Making of Barack Obama* by David J. Garrow**

Obama's speech at the 2004 Democratic National Convention instantly catapulted him into the national spotlight and led to his election four years later as America's first African-American president. Garrow has created a vivid portrait that reveals not only the people and forces that shaped the future president but also the ways in which he used those influences to serve his larger aspirations




### ***The Book Thief* by Markus Zusak**

Living with a foster family in Germany during World War II, a young girl struggles to survive her day-to-day trials through stealing anything she can get her hands on, but when she discovers the beauty of literature, she realizes that she has been blessed with a gift that must be shared with others, including the Jewish man hiding in the basement.




### ***No Ordinary Time: Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt: The Home Front in World War II* by Doris Kearns Goodwin**

Presents a social history of the United States in 1940, along with a moment-by-moment account of Roosevelt's leadership and the private lives of the president and First Lady, whose remarkable partnership transformed America. A remarkably riveting read.



### ***The Amazing Adventures of Kavalier and Clay: A Novel* by Michael Chabon**

With this brilliant novel, the bestselling author of *The Mysteries of Pittsburgh* and *Wonder Boys* gives us an exhilarating triumph of language and invention, a stunning novel in which the tragicomic adventures of a couple of boy geniuses reveal much about what happened to America in the middle of the twentieth century.



### ***The Discovery of Witches* by Deborah Harkness**

Witch and Yale historian Diana Bishop discovers an enchanted manuscript, attracting the attention of 1,500-year-old vampire Matthew Clairmont. The orphaned daughter of two powerful witches, Bishop prefers intellect, but relies on magic when her discovery of a palimpsest documenting the origin of supernatural species releases an assortment of undead who threaten, stalk, and harass her.



### ***Ali: A Life* by Jonathan Eig**

Based on more than 500 interviews, including Muhammad Ali's closest associates, and enhanced by access to thousands of pages of newly released FBI records, this is a thrilling story of a man who became one of the great figures of the twentieth century.
